Kurrinda BLOODSTOCK

ON THE TRACK

SUPER NORWEST 8/6 ROYAL RANDWICK 1100M 6TH/14

SUPER NORWEST returned to the races first up at Royal Randwick at Highway level with jockey Tim Clark in the saddle. Jumping from barrier 9 was always going to be tricky, and track conditions were testing on the day, being a heavy 9. But Super Norwest went into the race in good order and was pleasing us at home. She jumped brilliantly but got posted wide in the early stages. Tim was forced to give her a squeeze to try to get a good position, eventually sitting outside the leader. Super Norwest travelled well into the straight, being held together by Tim. She was asked for more at the 300m mark. After seeing off the long-time leader, she hit the front only to tire late and get overhauled by the swoopers, but it was a great first-up run only going down 2.4l. She is definitely up to Highway level and winning a couple of these races. Her time will come—exciting times ahead for her ownership group.





CROWN GUINEA
11/6 GATTON 1100M 5TH/12

CROWN GUINEA was looking to bounce back after being given very little chance last start on a track that was extremely biased to the rail on the day. She headed to Gatton looking for some improvement over the 1100m with jockey Michael Hellyer booked to ride, finally drawing a barrier after having no luck in her past few starts. She jumped from barrier 1, a bit slow as Hellyer urged her along, eventually sitting at the tail of the field. She travelled well once they settled down in a quick run race. Hellyer opted to ride for luck as they fanned out across the home straight. Crown Guinea made up good ground down the inside, which was slightly the less favoured part of the track on the day but finished off well to only be beaten 1.3 lengths, a nice run and good to see her prep back on track after a complete forgive second up run.

A DIME APPROACH
12/6 DOOMBEN 1650M 10TH/11

A DIME APPROACH stepped up to the Metropolitan level off the back of two very good efforts to start his prep this time in. He has come back in fantastic order and will be even better once he gets up to distances more suited to him. Damien Thornton was in the saddle, jumping from barrier 7. He jumped towards the back end of the field, and Thornton opted to settle three deep without cover in a race that was not run at a great speed. Combine this with the rail being out, the writing was on the wall at a very early stage here. As the race went on, we were pushed even further wide, sitting four wide for the majority of the race, covering ground throughout the race. On turning into the straight, there was nothing left for A Dime Approach to give, having no chance in a complete forgive run, especially when you consider the horse who finished 2nd here finished behind us last start, so on form, he could have been right in a race like this. A complete forget and move on race, we will look to step him up in distance next start.

CROWN GUINEA
21/6 KILCOY 1200M 3RD/10

CROWN GUINEA jumped from the widest barrier in 10 of 10 here. She has been extremely unlucky when it comes to barriers for a number of preps now. This was always going to be a tough task on the tight turning track. Jockey Michael Hellyer was forced to sit three wide the whole trip, a tough run, but she travelled well throughout. When asked for an effort, Crown Guinea responded well to make up good ground, but unfortunately, as the field made their runs on the home turn, she was forced even further wide, causing her to cover even more ground. She finished off great in the straight to grab 3rd place, a huge run considering how the race panned out here. Good to see her back in form, and we will look to step her up in trip now. With luck, she could well have nearly won here.

A DIME APPROACH
21/6 KILCOY 2000M 5TH/12

A DIME APPROACH headed to Kilcoy, "The Moonee Valley of QLD," looking to bounce back after a complete forget last start. Jumping from barrier 4 jockey Michael Hellyer in the saddle today, he jumped fair, Hellyer urged him along to and got into what looked like a great position on the rail behind the leader, but the extremely tight turning track was not to his liking being a big galloping horse. As the pace quickened, as he tends to, he came off the bridle but always has a good long sustained run. Unfortunately, the leader weakened, coming back into A Dime Approach's lap, causing a stop-start run, which is not ideal for this horse as he will gallop all day with clear running room. Eventually, when switched to the outside, with the very short straight at Kilcoy, he was unable to wind up again. If the leader had a bit of a kick and would have been able to take A Dime Approach into the race, even though he didn't love the tight track, he still could have featured in the finish here. An unlucky run, can't fault the ride from Michael or the effort from the horse, will be winning one soon for his owners with even luck.



BOSTON ROCKS
29/6 ROSEHILL 6TH/9

BOSTON ROCKS returned to the races first up for the Matthew Dale stable. In-form jockey Zac Lloyd was booked in the saddle fresh off his maiden Group One success. Drawn widest of all and on a heavy track, it was always going to be a tough ask, but Boston went into the race in great order. We felt if he handled the track conditions, he had the speed to offset the barrier and could well feature in the finish. Boston jumped well from the outside with some good early speed. As predicted, he found a spot and sat outside the leader in transit. He travelled well throughout the race, but when produced in the home straight, he didn't quite let down like we know he can. His stride shortened, and he just couldn't let down in the heavy conditions. With Zac confirming this post-race, he had lost no admiration for the horse. It was always going to be a gamble with the track conditions and turned out to be a case of a lesson learned with wet tracks going forward.

GET TO KNOW

This month, in our 'Get to Know' for June, is Kurrinda owner Adair Horne. Adair is lucky enough to be involved in some exciting young fillies with us in Satin Stiletto and Queen's Rhapsody, having owned a share in the Group 1 placed colt I Am Unstoppable as well.



QUESTION TIME

Q- How did you get the initial horse racing bug?

A- I went to a pub freshly after turning 18 with some mates and I was having my first ever horse racing bet and I took It's a Dundeel to win the Spring Champion Stakes and his finish of that race, the call of the race was what got me hooked. He's still my favourite horse of all time.

Q- What made you decide you wanted to get involved as a racehorse owner?

A- After I started punting on racing, I was on some horse racing forums and people were talking about syndicators. A few of them were going in a particular horse, so I decided to take a 10% share myself hoping I'd hit it big.

Q- How did you set about getting involved for the first time? And any advice for people thinking about it out there?

A- When I got first involved over 10 years ago, I saw people talking about syndicators and horse shares on a forum and I did a small amount of novice research and took the leap of faith to begin with. These days there's a hell of a lot more information out there for novice owners. I'd recommend deciding on how much you want to spend and then just go through what is available to see if anything catches your eye.



Q- What has been your personal favourite racing moment?

A- Running 2nd in the Coolmore Stud Stakes last year with a horse I had a share in, I Am Unstoppable, which we later sold to Widden Stud to become a stallion.

Q- What was it like to have a runner come so close in one of the biggest Group 1s of the Australian calendar?

A- The whole week leading up to it was very nerve-racking. I had a feeling in my gut that he was going to run well, and he really did. A slightly better run in transit could have seen him winning it, but it was a dream come true and a day I will never forget.

Q- Describe the feeling as an owner going into that Group 1?

A- Nerve-racking! I was shaking, my heart was beating out of my chest, and as soon as they jumped, everything just went silent and it was all a blur. It was exhilarating!

Q- You are involved in some nice horses including some exciting youngsters with Kurrinda Bloodstock, what are you most excited about over the next 12 months?

A- I'm excited to see how I Am Unstoppable's half-sister Satin Stiletto goes in the spring. She surprised me with her very gutsy run at Scone and hopefully she can emulate her big brother but go one better.

Q- If you could own any horse of any era, who? And why?

A- For some reason, I'd have to say Super Impose. He had a massive finish in him and carried weight and was involved in some incredible finishes to his races.

Q- One meeting or racecourse you would love to attend?

A- Probably the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe to see the best horses in the world compete.

Q- Best piece of punting advice to live by?

A- Don't take early fixed odds unless you're very confident it's going to tumble in price. The large majority of the time you'll get much better odds right on jump when the market percentage is at its lowest.



Q- If you could invite 3 people to dinner, dead or alive, who would you choose?

A- Ana De Armas, the Hawk Tuah girl, and Sydney Sweeney (all for personal reasons)

Q- Why would you recommend someone to become an owner with Kurrinda Bloodstock?

A- Communication is top-notch, you can see the love and care they have for the horses. They aren't just another number; you can see how much each horse is loved and appreciated.
