

So You Pence 2/5 Wagga I200M - Ist

Coming off a huge 7th length win at Goulburn a few weeks earlier, Matt Dale took So You Pence to a Benchmark 74 at the Wagga Carnival. She jumped well and sat outside the lead. a few horses pushed forward giving her something to chase. Ash gave her a squeeze and she put them away with relative ease winning by 3 lengths. In Anthony Mantons words once again 'this is a space job'

Bombay Boom 7/5 Warwick Farm 1000m - 9th

Bombay Boom again went to town to try and knock off his maiden. He was well found in the market as \$5.5 SP second favourite. He's always been a very fast horse so he was able to find the front quite easily. Unfortunately when the pressure came on in the last 400m he wasn't able to respond. Matt Dale/ Kurrinda Bloodstock have since made the decision to geld him (which has already happened). We beleive that will bring out the best for him as a racehorse

Super Norwest 10/5 Gosford I200m - 9th

Our 3rd Matt Dale runner for the month and Ash Morgan booked to ride. This was a Tab Highway at Gosford's stand alone Saturday meeting for the year. From a wide gate and strong speed on, Ash was posted very wide and turned the bend 9 wide. Given the pattern of the race Ash was able to make up ground from a long way back but was never going to be in the finish. So he nursed Super to the line. It was a much better run than the result portrays



ON THE TRACK

Hidden Motive 15/5 Haweskbury 1100M - 1st

A number of optimistic owners made the trek to Hawkesbury. We've always had a good opinion of Hidden Motive since his 4th in the Breeders Plate. Ash Morgan (I know he seems be becoming Kurrinda Bloodstocks stable jockey) pinged the gates and sat outside the lead. Ash held Hidden Motive together and let down at the 200m, and swiftly moved away from the field at the 100m winning by 4 lengths.

Queens Rhapsody 15/5 Hawkesbury 1100m - 1st

'The Queen' as a number of our owners affectionately know her was coming of four metro starts for four 2nds. sometimes a change of scenery can benefit so we've switched stable to Nathan Doyle. Lugged with 61KGs, but with William Stanleys 3KG claim, The Queen jumped well and took a sit mid field on the fence. as the field fanned on the bend she stuck to the rails and accelerated into the lead by the 300m. the most pleasing aspect of the run is when 'Miss Lee' came up behind her, The Queen kicked again for a comfortable one length victory

Satin Stiletto 17/5 Scone IIO0m - 6th

Scone Cup carnival is one of the great country carnivals. I'd encourage anyone to add it to their country cups bucket list. Satin Stiletto was Stakes Placed at this meeting in 2024 so we were back this time for the Listed Denise's Joy. She jumped exceptional and was able to push through into a forward position. She was always in the front 5 or 6 runners and ran a gallant 0.8 length 6th. With any more luck we would have had a little more black type on the page



Super Norwest 17/5 Randwick 1200M - 2nd

Coming off a solid run earlier in the month Super was well found in the market \$5 SP favourite. Our hoop Braith Nock, who is an accomplished country jockey was engaged as he can claim 2kgs in town. Super jumped well and was able to take a trail, all be it 3 wide. Braith peeled out 5 wide rounding the bend. He continued to build and pulled off some great last sectionals. It was only that 'A pound of Salt' got every ounce of luck in running and split the field to steal victory

Crown Guinea 25/5 Sunshine Cost 1000m -4th

It's been hard to get a run at Sunshine Coast lately with so many abandoned meetings. In a small field Crown Guinea missed the start but managed to make up ground settling 4th on the rail. In a bunched race and bunched finish Crown Guinea finish only 2 lengths behind a horse 'Taltarni Fields' who is touted to be a smart horse

Sovereign Dane 25/5 Sunshine I200m - 6th

A few races later, Stu Kendrick saddled our 2nd runner for the day. Jake Baylis was booked to ride and got into a lovely spot mid field on the fence. Sovereign Dane appeared to fade at the 400 but to his creditpicked up again again at the 200 to finish 1.6 lengths 6th



So You Pence 31/5 Rosehill 1200m -6th

Owners travelled from interstate to see our So You Think filly go to town for the first time. Up in class, a heavy 9 track and barrier 13 were all against us however So You Pence jumped well and settled midfield. She wasn't handling the heavy track and was ultimately beaten 3 lengths 6th. All parties Ash Morgan, Matt Dale and Sean from Kurrinda were very pleased with the run. With the prospect of heavy tracks for the next few months we'll tip her out for 3 weeks and get ready for the spring.


